On July 18, 2018 there was an event that took place in Warners, NY. It began with one person but grew in the end to involve numerous souls, amounting to an inestimable number if the truth be told. A young man went out to run from the BVMA campus towards the Erie Canal. This would be the longest run he had taken in his life up to this point. Never having undergone this degree of endurance before, he stopped by the chapel to seek assistance from God, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and offered his intentions of sacrifice — in the event he would have no energy during the course of the trek to think of such!

After a few miles, it was apparent that things were going well. No difficulties, little exhaustion, but many more miles to go! The pace was right, time was ticking, and nothing seemed to get in the way of completion. Throughout the course of travel, the mental game was being waged. Concentration was practiced, adjustments were made, principles were followed. There had been many elements of advice given leading up to this run and now was the time to ensure things were applied. Water was consumed from a Camelback, stretches were made, breathing was measured, and posture was kept. Evidently...something was going right!

More miles were behind him and more to go, but now it was time for a short rest to digest an outside energy source. Electrolytes were consumed in small amounts along the way in order to replenish the loss of nutrients. These came to be a game-changer as would be seen in the end.

All things considered — prayer, intercession, actual grace, intentions, advice, aids, virtue, and the collection of these within a part of a whole, made all the difference. Once eight (8) miles were completed, another short rest was taken to gain the final ounce of strength to carry forward. Then came a very interesting, symbolic, and perfect finale. The last portion of the run would cycle around a cemetery. There was a need to seek merit by praying for the souls in purgatory (cf. Eighth Sunday after Pentecost Gospel — Luke XVI — where we need to make friends to follow them into their everlasting dwelling; these will end in Heaven) by stopping for a brief moment (while time kept going).




